ALABAMA

Compliance Period: October 1 through September 30 of each year

Required Continuing Education for PTs and PTAs: 10 hours per compliance period

Effective October 1, 2014, the state of Alabama Board of Physical Therapy (ABPT) does not require pre-approval for continuing education activities. "All continuing education offerings, regardless of source will be accepted provided that it is directly related to the licensee's practice of physical therapy" and meets the general guidelines set forth by the board. Refer to page 14-16 of the Alabama Board of Physical Therapy Administrative Code.

All MAPS courses meet or exceed the general guidelines (see below) set forth by the Alabama Board of Physical Therapy for continuing education.

ABPT General Guidelines for qualifying Continuing Education for PTs; courses must meet all the following requirements:

- (1) Maintain, improve or expand skills or knowledge of the practice of physical therapy
- (2) Contribute to the professional competency of the licensee by means of an organized activity with clearly described or outlined course content, dates or timelines for completion, and times of instruction or activity engagement expectations
- (3) Pertain to common subjects related to the practice of physical therapy and are based upon referenced scientific evidence; practice-based evidence; case studies; clearly identified anecdotal experience; current or proposed regulation of practice; accepted professional guidelines; policy documents; or best practices
- (4) Conducted by experts in the subject matter -individuals with special education, training, and experience,
- (5) Include stated program goals/objectives.
- (6) Identify target audience or describes prerequisite levels of experience
- (7) Describe requirements for successful progression or completion when using self- directed methods of learning (i.e., self-study, online, video, audio, teleconference, etc.). Self-directed methods of instruction may utilize a post-test but cannot result in a pass/fail grade

(8) Include a certificate or other sufficient proof of completion -For a concurrent session conference that does not provide documentation of individual session(s) completed, each individual course attended must be verified by having a conference official or course instructor sign or stamp the session description in the conference program if the conference does not use an automated format that allows for individual course verification.

ALASKA

Compliance/Licensing Period: *Two years, ending on June 30th of even numbered years.*

Required Continuing Education for PTs and PTAs: *24 contact hours for PTs licensed for 12 months or more of the concluding licensing period; 12 contact hours for PTs licensed for less than 12 months of the concluding licensing period.*

The State of Alaska Board of Physical Therapy & Occupational Therapy requires that continuing education activities contribute directly to the professional competency of a PT or PTA and must be directly related to the skills and knowledge required to implement the principles and methods of physical therapy, as defined in AS 08.84.190. If so, those activities that are also approved or sponsored by the following organizations are considered pre-approved by the Alaska board: 1) the Alaska Physical Therapy Association; 2) the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) and other state chapters; 3) the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT); 4) other state physical therapy licensing boards; 5) American Medical Association category one and two continuing education courses that involve physical therapy and (6) continuing education activities sponsored by a professional organization or university approved by the Alaska Physical Therapy Association or the American Physical Therapy Association

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in Alaska as the State of Alaska Board of Physical Therapy & Occupational Therapy recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

ARIZONA

Compliance Period: *Two years, September 1st of even-numbered years through August 31st of the following even-numbered year.*

Required Continuing Education for PTs: *20 hours per two-year compliance period, at least 10 hours must be from "Category A".*

Arizona State Board of Physical Therapy recognizes activities as "Category A" if they have been approved by one of the following: 1) an accredited medical, PT or health care education program; 2) a national or state medical, PT, or health care association, or a component of the association; or 3) a national medical, PT or health care specialty society.

ARKANSAS

Compliance/Licensing Period: Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants must renew their licenses annually by March 1.

Continuing Education Requirements for PTs and PTAs: Two CEUs (20 contact hours) for PTs and one CEU (10 contact hours) for PTAs must be completed by December 31st in each biennium, to be submitted prior to odd numbered year renewals (prior to March 1st of odd numbered years).

To receive CEU credit for a program, it must be approved by the Arkansas State Board of Physical Therapy.

Currently there are no approvals for MAPS courses in Arkansas.

CALIFORNIA

License Renewal Period: A license to practice physical therapy must be renewed every two years. The expiration date is the last day of the licensee's birth month during the second year of a two-year term.

Continuing Education Requirements for PTs and PTAs: Continuing competency hours must be earned during the renewal period. For specific requirements please review the following information from the Physical Therapy Board of California's website. Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants are subject to the same continuing competency requirements

COLORADO

Renewal Period: All Colorado Physical Therapist licenses, except for PTLPs, expire on October 31 of even-numbered years.

Continuing Education PT Requirements: 30 contact hours per every 2-year renewal period, with at least 15 points from Category I learning activities. Please review the following information from the Colorado State Board of Physical Therapy's website for specific continuing education information regarding the state's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Program: www.colorado.gov

The Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies State Physical Therapy Board does not preapprove specific courses or providers. A licensee shall determine which activities and topics will meet his/her Learning Plan and goals and select an appropriate provider.

All MAPS courses meet or exceed Colorado Physical Therapy Board Standards for Category I Activities as per revisions from October 2017 (see below), and thus are accepted by the Colorado Department of Regulating Agencies State PT Board.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD) is the State Physical Therapy Board program through which a licensee can satisfy the continuing professional competency requirements in order to renew, reinstate, or reactivate a license. For each renewal period, the CPD program consists of the following elements:

1. A Reflective Self-Assessment Tool (RSAT) and establishment of learning goals;
2. Development of a Learning Plan;
3. Accrual of 30 points through Professional Development Activities (PDA). PDA are learning activities undertaken to increase a licensee's knowledge and skill or hone existing knowledge and skill for the purpose of continuing professional development. PDA are organized into Category I, II, and III activities with corresponding point values (refer to the Learning Plan and the Professional Development Activities (PDA) List). At least 15 points must be accrued from Category I activities; and
4. Once every 10 years, complete an Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (AKS), no more than two AKS will be credited in a 10 year period.

CONNECTICUT

Licensing Period: 1 year (most licenses expire in the first birth month following insurance and are renewable annually thereafter.)

Continuing Education Requirements for PTs and PTAs: 20 hours during the one-year period for which the license is being renewed.

The Connecticut Board of Examiners for Physical Therapists does not approve continuing education courses or pre-approve specific coursework for individual licensees, nor does the Board maintain a list of continuing education courses. The law does not specifically identify qualifying continuing education course work.

All MAPS courses may be used towards meeting the required continuing education requirements for PTs/PTAs in Connecticut.

DELAWARE

Licensing Period: Licenses expire on January 31 of odd years.

Continuing Education Requirements: 3.0 CEUs are required every biennial license renewal for PTs, PTAs and ATs, including 0.2 units of ethics and 0.1 unit for a CPR course.

The State of Delaware Examining Board of Physical Therapists and Athletic Trainers recognizes continuing education units that have been previously approved during the current licensing period by another agency such as a national governing body, for example, APTA and BOC, or a fellow state licensing board.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in Delaware as the State of Delaware Examining Board of Physical Therapists and Athletic Trainers recognizes that MAPS has been approved by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Licensing Period: Two-year period, odd numbered years.

Continuing Education Requirements: For Physical Therapists 40 contact hours per two-year period. (No more than twenty (20) hours of approved continuing education credits earned through internet courses). For Physical Therapist Assistants thirty (30) hours of approved continuing education.

The District of Columbia Board of Physical Therapy does not preapprove continuing education courses. Acceptable continuing education is automatically approved if it is approved by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) or any of its state chapters, or any state board of Physical Therapy.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in the District of Columbia, which recognizes the MAPS approval by New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

FLORIDA

Licensing Period: The biennium runs from 12/1/odd year-11/30/next odd year.

Continuing Education Requirements: Twenty-four (24) contact hours of continuing education must be completed within the current biennium for which the license is being renewed. A one hour HIV/AIDS course is required for first license renewal. Two hours on prevention of medical errors must be taken every renewal period. No more than 12 hours can be from home-study.

The Florida Board of Physical Therapy (FBPT) recognizes courses approved by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA), including other state APTA chapters and APTA sections.

IMPORTANT NOTE: To receive credit for courses approved by APTA chapters outside the state of Florida, Licensees **must self-report** the course to CEBroker.com, or individually apply to FPTA. MAPS is happy to provide any additional information needed for course approvals.

GEORGIA

Licensing Period for PTs and PTAs: Two-year period ending on December 31st of odd years.

Continuing Education Requirements for PTs and PTAs: 30 contact hours required for each two-year licensure period, with a maximum of 10 credit hours per calendar day. These 30 hours must include 4 hours of ethics and jurisprudence.

The Georgia State Board of Physical Therapy does not pre-approve any continuing education courses. However, Georgia Rules and Regulations #490-4-.02 concerning PT/PTA Continuing Competency Requirements and Board Policy #7 identifies learning experiences that provide content beyond the licensee's present level of knowledge and competence, subject to audit by the board. Content of the experience must relate to patient care in physical therapy whether the subject is research, treatment, documentation, education, management, or some other content area.

Courses considered approved by the Georgia State Board of Physical Therapy include, but are not limited to, those approved by the APTA and its affiliate components, the Physical Therapy Association of Georgia or any other state chapters, programs at CAPTE-Accredited Colleges/Universities when the continued competency course is held under the auspices of the school of physical therapy, or programs offered by similar professional organizations offering experiences that meet Rule 490-4-.02 guidelines.

All MAPS courses comply with the guidelines for continuing education of PTs and PTAs set by of the Georgia Board of Physical Therapy Rule 490-4-.02. In addition, MAPS is a pre-approved authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

HAWAII

Licensing Period: Biennial ending December 31st every even numbered year.

Continuing Education Requirements: 30 CCUs per biennial. 1 CCU=at least 50 minutes of classroom or hands on instruction.

The Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Board of Physical Therapy accepts continued competence courses approved by another state or jurisdiction's physical therapy board or its equivalent.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved by the Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Board of Physical Therapy as the Hawaii Board of Physical Therapy recognizes the New York State

Education Department Board of Physical Therapy of MAPS as a pre-approved authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs by the N, effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

IDAHO

Licensing Period: *One-year period.*

Continuing Education Requirements: *16 Hours of Continuing Education per licensing period.*

The Idaho Physical Therapy Licensure Board pre-approves courses.

ILLINOIS

Licensing Period: *Two-year period ending on September 30th of each even year.*

Continuing Education Requirements: *40 hours of continuing education for PTs and 20 hours for PTAs prior to each renewal. At least 3 hours must include content related to the ethical practice of physical therapy. A maximum of 50% of total CE requirements may be earned through self-study.*

The Illinois Department of Financial & Professional Regulation's Physical Therapy Licensing and Disciplinary Board recognizes courses approved by the Illinois Physical Therapy Association, other APTA chapters, and CAPTE. They also authorize pre-approved Sponsors whose programs comply with the continuing education criteria set forth in the Illinois Physical Therapy Act Section 1340.61. Licensees may also claim credit from nonapproved activities in another jurisdiction upon application to the Board and payment of a \$20 processing fee.

Maitland-Australian Physiotherapy Seminars (MAPS) is approved by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation CE Sponsor License #216.000343. CEUs have been calculated based upon standards set by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT).

INDIANA

Licensing Period: *Two-years ending on June 30th of even-numbered years.*

Continuing Education Requirements: *22 hours of continuing competency activities for the biennial renewal period in which 2 hours must be in an ethics and Indiana jurisprudence course as it related to the practice of PT.*

The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's Physical Therapy Committee recognizes federal, state and local government agencies as approved organizations for the purpose of approving continuing competency courses.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in Indiana, as the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's Physical Therapy Committee recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education

Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective **October 9, 2018** through **October 8, 2021**.

IOWA

Licensing Period: Two-years extending from the 16th of the licensees birth month through the 15th of the birth month two years later.

Continuing Education Requirements: 40 hours of continuing education per licensing period for PTs, with a minimum of 30 hours directly and primarily related to the clinical application of physical therapy. For PTAs, a minimum of 20 hours is required with a minimum of 15 hours related to the clinical application of physical therapy.

The Iowa Board of Physical & Occupational Therapy does not pre-approve continuing education providers, sponsors or individual programs. It is the licensees' responsibility to determine if the continuing education programs they attend meet the requirements of 645-203.3 (148A,272C) standards.

All MAPS courses meet the general criteria for an activity appropriate for credit in Iowa as detailed in the Iowa Board of Physical Therapy Continuing Education requirement 645-203.3(1).

KANSAS

UTAH

Licensing Period: Two-year period commencing on May 31st of each odd-numbered year.

Continuing Education Requirements: 40 contact hours per two-year period for PTs, and 20 contact hours for PTAs.

As per Utah Administrative Code, Physical Therapy Practice Act R156-24b-303b approved continuing education providers include courses approved by, conducted by, or under the sponsorship of one of the following: a recognized accredited college or university, a state or federal agency, a professional association, organization, or facility involved in the practice of physical therapy, or a commercial continuing education provider providing a course related to the practice of physical therapy. The Utah Physical Therapy Association approval is also accepted by the Utah Board of Physical Therapy.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in Utah as the Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing Physical Therapy Board recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective October 9, 2018 through October 8, 2021.

VERMONT

Licensing Period: Two-year period ending September 30th of the even numbered years.

Continuing Education Requirements: 24 contact hours per two-year period.

The Vermont Office of Professional Regulation recognizes continuing competence pre-approvals by any agency or board responsible for licensing individuals to practice physical therapy in the United States or Canada, the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA), including any sections, credentialed residencies and fellowships and its accrediting subsidiary, state chapters of APTA, the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT), and any accrediting subsidiary, and any providers approved or accredited by the agencies or organizations listed in this paragraph.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved in Vermont as the Vermont Office of Professional Regulation recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective October 9, 2018 through October 8, 2021.

VIRGINIA

Licensing Period: Two-year period ending December 31st of even-numbered years.

Continuing Education Requirements: 30 contact hours per two-year period with a minimum of 20 hours for PTs and 15 hours for PTAs in Type I courses and no more than 10 hours for PTs and 15 for PTAs in Type II activities.

The Virginia Board of Physical Therapy recognizes courses approved or provided by the following organizations or any of its components: Virginia Physical Therapy Association, the American Physical Therapy Association, local, state or federal government agencies, regionally accredited colleges and universities, health care organizations accredited by a national accrediting organization granted authority by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to assure compliance with Medicare conditions of participation, the American Medical Association--Category I Continuing Medical Education course, the National Athletic Trainers Association, or the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy.

All MAPS courses are pre-approved Virginia Board of Physical Therapy Type I activities as the Virginia Board of Physical Therapy recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective October 9, 2018 through October 8, 2021.

WASHINGTON

Licensing Period: Licenses must be renewed every two years on the practitioner's birthday.

Continuing Education Requirements: PTs require 32 contact hours per two-years and PTA require 24 contact hours.

The Washington State Department of Health does not require pre-approval for continuing education activities, although licensed PTs and PTAs must provide evidence of meeting required hours prior to license renewal. Continuing education courses must be specifically related to the practice of physical therapy with identified course goals and objectives.

All MAPS courses are related to the practice of physical therapy with specified goals and objectives, thus meeting the criteria for continuing education by the Washington State Department of Health.

WEST VIRGINIA

Licensing Period: Licenses expire biennially; December 31st of even or odd years depending on when the license was issued.

Continuing Education Requirements: 24 contact hours biennially.

The West Virginia State Board of Physical Therapy requires pre-approval of courses through CEU Locker, but grants automatic approval for courses sponsored by the APTA, the WVPTA, and any CAPTE accredited school.

Currently there are no approvals for MAPS courses in West Virginia.

WISCONSIN

Licensing Period: Licenses expire on February 28th of odd years.

Continuing Education Requirements: 30 contact hours biennially. 4 hours must be in ethics and jurisprudence.

The Wisconsin Physical Therapy Examining Board accepts credit for a continuing education program/course shall: 1) constitute an organized program of learning that contributes directly to the licensee's knowledge, skill, behavior, and abilities related to the practice of physical therapy, 2) pertain to subject matters which integrally relate to the practice of the profession, 3) be conducted by individuals who have specialized education, training or experience by reason of which the individuals should be considered qualified concerning the subject matter of the activity or program, 4) fulfill pre-established goals and objectives and 5) provide proof of attendance by licensees. The Wisconsin Physical Therapy Examining Board also accepts courses approved by the Wisconsin Physical Therapy Association.

All MAPS courses meet the minimum standards required for approval by the Wisconsin Physical Therapy Examining Board, and therefore can be submitted by each licensee to the board for approval. MAPS provides all necessary documents upon request.

WYOMING

Licensing Period: Licenses expire on October 1st of odd or even years depending on when they were licensed.

Continuing Education Requirements: 30 contact hours biennially for PTs and PTAs; at least 15 hours must be from Category A.

The Wyoming Board of Physical Therapy recognizes activities as Category A by any of the following approved providers: 1) the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA), including any sections, credentialed residencies and fellowships and its accrediting subsidiary, 2) state Chapters of the APTA, 3) Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy and any accrediting subsidiary, 4) the International Association for Continuing Education Training, 5) any providers approved or accredited by the agencies or organizations listed in 1) through 4).

All MAPS courses are pre-approved as a Category A continuing education by the Wyoming Board of Physical Therapy as it recognizes the MAPS approval by the New York State Education Department Board of Physical Therapy, as an authorized provider of continuing education for PTs and PTAs effective October 9, 2018 through October 8, 2021.
